abundant choices. Our southern Appalachian mountains are the most biologically diverse ecological system on earth!

My first love was Crested Dwarf Iris. When I first saw them in North Georgia, I was amazed by their beauty. It took me almost the entire spring to find out their name. Each year, enjoy seeing them again.

Do you look forward to seeing your flower friends each year? You probably know where your favorites are and seek them every year. I want to share with you some of my favorites and some of the places I go to see them.

Another favorite are the **Regency** trilliums. The Great Smoky Mountain National Park has 7 varieties of trilliums. My favorite varieties are the Vasey's, with its bright burgundy flower hidden under its leaves, and the Painted Trilliums. Both can be found on the Appalachian Trail going north from Winding Stair Gap.

The Little Brown Jugs, a wild ginger, have unique flowers shaped like jugs. They can be found in abundance on the Miller Trek trail in Young Harris. Dutchman's Britches and Squirrel Corn also have unusual shaped flowers. I look for Pink Lady

Slippers on the Jack's Knob trail on the way up to Brasstown Bald. Every year we count 150 or more blooming flowers. The Yellow Lady Slippers are more rare. We go south on the Appalachian Trail (AT) from Hog Pen Gap to see the yellow variety.

Blood Root has such them in a number of places, esfrom Unicoi Gap.

Unicoi State Park near Helen, Georgia. My husband was so excited by their beauty that he told everyone he saw and they got excited too!
