Lorraine and Bennett Hammond will be featured in concert at 7:30 p.m. Friday, June 11 at the John C. Campbell Folk School in Brasstown. The concert will be held in the Festival Barn, but those attending are urged to park near Keith House or the Dining Hall and walk to the Festival Barn where there will be only a limited number of handicapped parking spaces available. Since there is limited seating, audience members may wish to bring a portable chair. The concert is free but donations are welcome.

Lorraine Hammond was born and raised in the mountains of Northwestern Connecticut when traditional music was still a normal part of community life. She is well known as a folk singer and songwriter, an accomplished player and teacher of the Celtic harp and the 5-string banjo, and as perhaps the foremost exponent of the Appalachian dulcimer. Lorraine is a regularly featured teacher and performer at venues around the country.

It's All About the Dogs!



For the last six weeks the Blairsville Mountain Shelter staff, each with their selected shelter dog, has had the opportunity to learn the latest positive reinforcement training techniques to help all of the dogs become more adoptable. This program has been possible due to the generous donation of time and expertise of Lisa Waggoner & Brad Waggoner of Cold Nose College, located in Murphy, NC.

Dogs aren't born knowing English or how to fit into our human world, so it's up to us to teach them in a humane and effective way. The American Veterinary Society of Animal Behavior recommends positive reinforcement training. Like people, dogs aren't perfect. Being proactive and rewarding good behavior is so much easier than trying to change bad behaviors after they have happened. By using something the dog finds rewarding (food, toys and life rewards) it's easy to teach a dog what "to do" vs. just stopping a behavior. The shelter staff has learned how to set dogs up for success, not failure. It has been so rewarding to see how quickly the dogs progressed, even during the first week. Gone are many of the problem behaviors, which have been replaced with learning to focus on the handler, sitting politely for greeting and learning to sit and down. All of the dogs who went through this program are, of course, available for adoption. Come by and check them out!

Our shelter employee, Michael Mustin, is currently enrolled in the Cold Nose College Apprenticeship Program and will be the shelter consultant on staff to advise both shelter staff and volunteers on positive training techniques. We are very thankful to have so many dedicated volunteers who donate their time for the enrichment of our animals, with the ultimate goal to make the adoptions not only possible, but successful.
