Randy Dunn career achievements

Randy Dunn's career as a player, coach and athletics director:

- · Played three seasons for the North Georgia College Saints basketball team.
- Graduated in 1980 from NGC after three seasons on the hardwood.
- Began his career as an assistant coach at Georgia Southwestern State University, where he received a master's degree in physical education.
- · Became an assistant coach for the University of West Georgia
- Returned to NGC in 1982 as an assistant coach.
- Later, served 14 years as head coach of the Saints' Men's Basketball program.
- In 1996, Dunn's Saints won the Georgia-Alabama-Carolina Conference regular season championship and advanced to the NAIA National Tournament.
- In 1996, Dunn was named GACC men's basketball "Coach of the Year."
- In 2003, Dunn began serving as full-time athletics director at NGCSU.
- Dunn led the university's transition from the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics to NCAA Division II and into the Peach Belt Conference in 2005.

As NGCSU athletics director, Dunn oversaw the addition of five new sports at NGCSU: men's

- and women's golf, women's soccer, baseball and softball. He also oversaw the expansion of the university's facilities to include an athletic complex for baseball, softball and soccer. Under Dunn's watchful eye, the NGCSU athletic program produced 12 conference
- championships in the Georgia Athletic Conference, the GACC, and the Southern States Athletic Conference. For the past two seasons, the university's softball team has earned the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional championship and competed in the College World Series.
- June 7th, 2010, Dunn was named athletics director at Young Harris College to help lead the school into the transition to NCAA Division II athletics.
