Interview with Andrea Bowman, 2010 President of the Northeast Georgia Board of Realtors.

How long have you been a real estate professional? I have been a licensed Real Estate Agent for more than ten years and have a background in business administration. What advice would you give someone looking to be-

come a real estate professional? Are your customers today coming from the same areas as in previous years? We still see a high number of our Customers coming from the Southeastern Region of the United States, but I believe we will start to see more and more International visitors and Investors, with opportunities for investment and home ownership in the U. S.

What indications do you have regarding the local real estate market? Have we hit bottom? Are we on our way back up? Overall the Real Estate Market remains sluggish. The good news is that we have seen a National rise in home sales over the last few months and a significant increase over this time last year. The National median price declined an average of 3 % from May to June but this is mostly due to Foreclosures. We still have a large volume of foreclosed properties and according to our MLS statistics in the 6 County area that we cover, over 30% of our sales volume has been in foreclosed properties over the last few months. I believe that we will continue to see many more foreclosed and distressed property sales and that this will continue for at least the next 12 to 18

Do you think the local real estate market will ever recover to the point that it was in 2006 & 2007? There is a light at the end of our tunnel, as we start to see more investors taking advantage of the great opportunities that are out there. Land sales have seen an improvement, and homes that are priced to sell are doing just that.

What percentage of your clientele is looking for foreclosures? I rarely work with a customer anymore that doesn't at least inquire about foreclosures, what's out there, and are

Do today's buyers have more difficulty with financing approval than in previous years? As lending regulations tighten and new laws are implemented, the loan process has become more difficult, but buyers with a good credit history and available down payment funds are still able to obtain loans.

What can sellers do to compete with foreclosures? The competition with foreclosures is the most difficult Challenge for todays Sellers, and its all about pricing.
