Athelyn said the secret is working through the good times and the bad times.

"You have so many couples nowadays who decide when they get married that if it doesn't work out, that it's not hard to get a divorce," she said. "I think years ago when people married, they were marrying for life. That has to be in your mindset when you take the step of marriage.
