Indians rally for first regular season victory at Highlands

County Indians Varsity Basketball Team traveled high into the clouds on a rainy Friday night last week to face the Highlands, North Carolina, Highlanders. They rallied the last half from a 12-point half time deficit to bring home their first win of the regu-

The Indians trailed by as much as 13-2 in the first quarter and 26-13 in the second with the scores being 15-6 and 26-14 at the first two quarter breaks. Stetson Hedden led first half scoring for the Indians with five

The Indians gradually closed the gap in the third and fourth quarters in overtaking the Highlanders in the closing minutes of the game. An early third quarter trey by Ryan Tallent and a deuce by Brandon Henderson got the Indians within 26-19 but they still trailed 32-23 near the mid point of the quarter.

They closed the gap to 32-31 by the 1:24 mark on an 8-0 run provided by a field goal by Henderson and three-point plays

by Aaron Dodson and Henderson but a Highlands jumper at the buzzer had the Highlanders ahead 34-31 entering the fourth quarter. Henderson scored 7 points and Dodson and Tallent 5 each during third quarter play.

The Highlanders extended their lead again to 39-33 approaching the mid point of the fourth quarter but the Indians embarked on a 12-3 run for a 45-42 lead by the two minute mark with a trey by Tallent getting them even at 42-42 and a free throw by Rylan Albach giving them a 43-42 lead at the 2:18 mark they would not relinquish. A Highlands' free throw at 1:15 cut the lead to 45-43 but Dallas Manus sank two free throws at 44.3 seconds only to have the second negated by an Indian lane violation and the lead was again three at 46-43.

Several Highlanders shots missed the mark after that and Tallent put the game out of reach with the second of two free throws at 4.5 seconds, giving the Indians the final margin of 47-43 for their first win of the young season. Talent and Henderson took the lead in fourth quarter
