Indian JV's get first win over rival Union County Free

It just doesn't get any better than last Saturday's rousing come from behind victory by the Towns County Indian JV's over their arch rival, the Class AA Union County Panthers. While attracting much attention with inspiring play in their three earlier games at Dawson County, Hiwassee Dam, and Hayesville, that first win had eluded them but they got that monkey off their backs in their home opener against their biggest rival.

When Union used deadly 3-point shooting to spring out to a 12-2 lead which eventually became 19-6 by the four minute mark of the second quarter, hope for an upset victory seemed to be dim for that first win of the young season. The Panthers had included four treys in less than five and a half minutes at the start of the game and five for fifteen of those first 19 points.

When the visiting Panthers' hot shooting cooled off significantly, however, the Indians would dominate the remainder of the game. Austin Wood triggered a 16-2 run with a jump shot at the 3:25 mark with back to back treys by Grand Arencibia in just eighteen seconds near the two minute mark and three point plays by Ryan Tallent and Dallas Manus highlighting the run. Tallent's three point play got the Indians a 19-19 tie and Manus got them a 22-21 lead although Union sank a field goal at the buzzer for a 23-22 lead at intermission.

A trey by Arencibia just thirty two seconds into the third quarter got the Indians ahead 25-23 and another by the sharp shooting eighth grader

would never relinquish at the 5:44 mark. This trey triggered a 12-0 run for a 39-27 lead which would become 39-29 at quar-ter's end. After Aaron Dodson opened the fourth quarter with opened the fourth quarter with opened the game with a 10-2 a trey for a 42-29 lead, the Panthers sent the Indians to the foul line nineteen times where they had struggled in prior games but they sank thirteen of the nineteen for excellent 68.4 percent accuracy. They led by as much as 56-38 before closing out a resounding 57-41 victory.

Leaders in scoring for the game were Arencibia with 18 points, Manus with 12, Brett Barrett with 6, and Wood with 5. Leading in assists according to a 27-14 lead by the five minute your reporter's unofficial totals were Manus with 3 and Tallent with 2. Tallent performed a bit of double duty, playing a couple of quarters in the JV game and remaining eligible for three more in the varsity game.

While Arencibia and Manus carried the majority of the scoring load, this was truly a team victory as evidenced by ten of eleven Indians playing in the game entering the scoring column and the eleventh player, Steve Bennett, entering the rebounding column. Bennett, a freshman, is the tallest player on an overall very tall team in his first year of basketball and, although not yet entering the scoring column, he has drawn praise for his rapid improvepractice and games.

The Indians then trailed by just a 17-13 score be-fore the Yellow Jackets closed out the second quarter with the final four points for a 21-13 lead at halftime.

Hayesville spurted out to mark of the third quarter but here came the Indians again. A field goal by Davenport, two free throws by Garrett Bradshaw, a trey by Grant Arencibia, a basket by Luke Parker, a drive for two and then a trey by Arencibia, and a free throw by Brett Barrett between the 4:41 and 26.6 marks of the quarter gave the Indians a 15-5 run and just a 32-29 deficit.

Hayesville, NC - The Towns County Lady Indian JV's roared past the Hayesville Lady Yellow Jackets last Tuesday night in Hayesville before seeing a fourth quarter rally by Union County in the TCHS Gym propel the Lady Panthers past the Lady Indians on Saturday afternoon.
