Indians play great baseball in Savannah Tournament over weekend

Towns County High School finished 2-1 in a threeday baseball tournament this past weekend in Savannah.

The Indians traveled to Alfred E. Beach High School in Savannah on Thursday, Feb. 21, and stayed through Saturday, Feb. 23. They were the only single A school who competed.

And even though the Indians had only gotten to play one game prior to the tournament due to bad weather, they played some great baseball over the weekend, outscoring their opponents 37-13.

In Game 1 of the tournament, the Indians played Beach High School, a triple-A team. Freshman Collin Crowder made his first varsity start on the mound and pitched a good game, only giving up just two unearned runs.

Crowder pitched into the third inning before senior Trent Bradshaw was called in to finish the inning. Bradshaw only pitched for one inning due to the Indians having a 17-point lead over Beach.

Senior Seth Fullerton went 2-2, scored 3 runs, 4 RBIs and had a triple; Brett



Denton went 0-2 with 3 runs; Bryan County High School Bradshaw 1-1, one hit, and one RBI; Andrew Griffin 3-4, one run, and two RBIs; Kayden McClure 1-1, two runs, and it was our best game of the one RBI; Devyn Burrell 0-3, one run; Aidan Berrong 1-3, three runs, and one RBI; and heading into the fourth, we Lane Denton 1-1, two runs, made a run driving in 4 runs and an RBI.

Senior Brett Denton hit the ball very well in Game 2, going 2-4 at the plate with a triple, two RBIs, and scoring three runs. Sophomore Aiden Berrong hit a sac fly, getting

one of his two RBIs as Denton scored his run from the triple.

Berrong was 1-3 at the plate. Seth Fullerton went 1-4, one run, and one RBI. Bradshaw, Kayden McClure, Devyn Burrell, and Lane Denton all went 1-3.

Senior Seth Fullerton pitched a no-hitter in Game 3 against Liberty County. He certainly pitched a great game, but some great defense helped him finish the game with the no-hitter. Fullerton struck out three batters on 69 pitches, only walking one batter in the sixth.

Fullerton gave up one unearned run off an error as the baserunner stole second and then scoring as a result of the error. Fullerton also hit the ball well, going 1-2 for one RBI.

Senior Kayden McClure hit the ball great in Game 3, going 3-3 at the plate with two RBIs and scoring a run. Denton was 1-4 with one run scored, Andrew Griffin 1-1, two runs scored, Berrong 1-4 with one run and one RBI, Bradshaw 1-2 and one RBI, Lane Denton 1-3 and one run, and Crowder 0-3 with a run.

The Indians' next game will be the home opener on Wednesday, Feb. 27, at 4:30 p.m. against Lincoln County.

Senior Will Travis was 51 for 70 for 72.9-percent from the start of the Battle of the States tournament after just 25 for 45 accuracy in prior games; senior Brett Denton sank all eight of his free throw attempts for 100percent from January 8 through the end of the season after just six for 15 success prior; sophomore Aidan Berrong was 27 for 39 for 69.2-percent success from January 8 forward after just 29 for 56 prior; and senior Trent Bradshaw improved with 21 for 31 accuracy for 67.7-percent from December 7 until a season ending injury on February 1 after missing his first six attempts.

Although freshman Collin Crowder doesn't fit the improvement trend of the four above, his performance at the foul line as a fourteen years old freshman a very brief period of just six for January 25. So a general kudos item in a previous article to the teammates of Kolby Moss became much more impressive when viewing details not noted prior to writing the previous entry and congratulations are due for excelteammates.
