

MARTINSVILLE. VA - Brad Keselowski put on a driving show for the fans and 42 other drivers Sunday at Martinsville. He led 446 laps of the 500 lap Cup Series race on the way to victory.


Keselowski took the lead from teammate and after six laps, and remained in charge for the next 319 laps, which included both stage wins.

Runner-up Elliott, who had hounded Keselowski for much of the race, finally made the pass for the lead on Lap 320, and held onto it for 49 laps. Keselowski beat him out of the pits under a caution period during lap 376, and Elliott was never able to regain it. This was the first time this season Elliott had led any laps, the latter half of the race. He tried to catch Keselowski in the waning laps, but couldn't get to the No. 2 driver, who went on to win his second race of 2019.

"I'm not sure what we needed there at the end," said Elliott. "We made a lot of changes, but they didn't give us what we needed. I couldn't catch up with him at the end, so I don't know if we could have done anything with him."
