

NASCAR 2019 By Gerald Hodges/the Racing Reporter Hamlin Wins At Texas

Ft. Worth, TX - Kyle Busch looked like he was headed for a third consecutive victory after winning both the Truck and Xfinity Series events at Texas Motor Speedway. But while leading Sunday's Cup race, on lap 275 of the 334 lap race, his car swerved up into the outside wall. He had to pit and went a lap down.

His Joe Gibbs Racing teammate Denny Hamlin, who had won Stage Two, gained the lead after a round of green flag nit stops on lap

NASCAR could only shuffle the order of its races rather than opting to replace or depart from previous tracks.

there at the end," said Bowyer. "At the start, we couldn't run with the leaders, but after we got the car adjusted, it did pretty well.

Third-place finisher Daniel Suarez, who was Hamlin and Kyle Busch's teammates last year, but moved to Stewart-Haas Racing also had his best finish.

"This run was good for us," said Suarez. "We needed this. We've changed and switched things around hoping for something better, and today we finally see we are making progress.'

Eric Jones, third member of JGR led twice for 30 laps to finish fourth, his best of the season.

Fifth-place finisher and Polesitter, Jimmie Johnson, led twice for sixty laps. It was also his best finish of the year.

William Byron, Aric Almirola, Kevin Harvick, Kurt Busch, and Kyle Busch rounded out the top-10 finishers.

"The car just broke away from me going through that corner," said Busch, who led the most laps (66). "I was just trying to keep my lap times up, but it broke loose and almost came around on me.'

Brad Keselowski staged a dominating performance last week at Martinsville, but had mechanical problems with his No. 2 Ford and wound up with a DNF.

EXPECT 2020 SCHEDULE CHANGES

NASCAR unveiled its 2020 Cup Series lineup last week. Chief among the changes is moving the championship race from Homestead-Miami Speedway to the Phoenix Raceway. Homestead's lone race fair, please exit your vehicle." will move to March 22

NASCAR's West Coast swing - Las Vegas, Fontana and Phoenix - moves up a weekend. Those three races will now immediately follow the Daytona 500.

Consequentially, Atlanta Motor Speedway's spring race, usually held the second weekend of the season, moves to the middle of March.

Davtona International Speedway's summer race — typically 4th of July weekend - switches with the Brickyard 400 at Indianapolis Motor Speedway, which previously was the final regular-season race. The summer Daytona race will now serve as the regular-season finale.

Darlington Raceway's Labor Day weekend race will now be the first race of the playoffs rather than the ending weekend of the regular season.

NASCAR will attempt a Cup Series doubleheader at Pocono Raceway, with Cup events on both Saturday and Sunday of the same weekend.

Two consecutive off weekends in July and August during the Summer Olympics.

The playoff cutoff races move to Bristol, the Roval at Charlotte Motor Speedway, and then Martinsville, respectively. Martins-
