## Indians hand Providence its first region loss in 10-0 rout

Towns County falls 5-4 in extra innings to Class AAAA Chestatee

The Indians (6-12, 2-2) picked up a Region 8-A victory over Providence (11-9, 4-1) after jumping out to a 6-0 lead after two innings and cruising to a 10-0 win in six innings.

Zach Davenport and Adam Barrett combined on the six-inning shutout with Davenport getting the start and struck out five and allowing six hits over five innings.

Barrett worked a scoreless sixth – striking out one and surrendering one hit.

Both pitchers received plenty of help from the lineup as Towns County pummeled Providence to the tune of 14 hits. However, most of the support came from Davenport as he helped himself with a 4-for-4 day at the plate with a double and 2 RBIs.


