Indians golfers make ready for fifth straight appearance in State Tourney

The Towns County Boys Golf Team is heading to its fifth straight state tournament on Monday, May 20, and Tuesday, May

This year, the Georgia High School Association Public Single-A Golf State Tournament will be held at the Southern Landings Golf Course in Warner Robins.

Only the Top Three teams in the Area Tournament qualified to compete in the state tournament, but any golfer who managed to shoot below an 85 qualified as an

The state event will be judged on the Top Four scores, and each school can bring up to

Since 2017, the State Championship has been a 36-hole, twoday event, though during the first year of the two-day event, the weather only allowed for one day

The 2018 GHSA State Championship was held in Commerce at the Double Oaks Golf Course, and the Indians finished their first full 36-hole tournament in Third Place behind Schley County and back-to-back State Champs Gordon Lee.

During next week's tournament, the Indians will need to have four golfers shoot sub-80 for both days of the event, as that's what it will take to beat schools like Gordon Lee and Drew Charter.

Gordon Lee and Drew Charter have four players who shoot in the 70s, and the latter finished with a 322 during Area, which was the lowest score.

'We have played this course before, and I feel like I speak for everyone that we will have a good feel for it after our practice round," said Indian golfer Danny Reagan. "We have to try and shoot consistent rounds in the 70s or low 80s. There's some good competition, but I feel like Towns can keep up and have a shot to win."

The Indians are taking five golfers to state next week, and all five golfers are capable of shooting



in the 70s. Towns County's low score medalist for the Area Tournament was senior Kyler Garett, who shot a 79, and sophomore

Nick Sisco completed Area with an 84, with senior Will Travis finishing at 87. "I have seen all of us play great golf all year, so I know if we are all playing like I know we can, we should be able to get some great
