I sometimes wonder if this could possibly be the same planet I grew up on, or whether I and an undetermined number of friends and associates, mostly Americans, have somehow been transported into an alternative universe. Granted, the "old world" had a lot of problems, but there at least seemed to be a certain logic to the progression of events, and a lot more common

The old universe was diverse in its myriad expressions of humanity.
