The 25 year old model's grandmother Frances Moon is a resident of Blairsville, where she has spent a lot of time fishing on Lake Nottely.


"I love how peaceful it is up there," she said. "And my favorite memory would be fishing with my Granny, Frances Moon and Pawpaw, Ken Moon."
