to the way Ukraine shares a 1300 -mile border with Russia, Ira had no navy, no long-range bombers or
7000 miles from the nearest US border.
That war, completely illegal, went unpunished, as did
the people who ordered it: President George W. Bush and Vic President Dick Cheney.
The same is true of the US invasion of Afghanistan in 2001 and capture or destroy the Al Qaeda terrorist organization whic was primarily based in Afghanistan, guests of that country's Tali
ban government, which claimed not to know that the group and it leader, the Saudi Arabian Osama Bin Laden, were plotting
terrorist attack on the World Trade Towers and the Pentagon Because this was not an attack by Afghanistan, and because th
Taliban was ready to surrender Bin Laden and his accomplices if offered assurances that they would not be executed - an offer the
US refused - there was no justification for that invasion o the 20 -year war and occupation that followed it, whose aim shifted
from pursuing Al Qaeda to ousting the Taliban from power. The US invasion of Libya and the overthrow and murder of its leader
Muammar Qaddaf in 2011 was similarly a war crime, as, like the invasion of Afghanistan and Iraq before it, was never sanctione
by any UN Security Council Vote, and because Libya posed no threat to the US, imminent or otherwise, as required under inter
national law. President Obama, who ordered that war, is also as much a war criminal as is President Putin. 63,000 civilian - many of them children - in the years since September 2001, other illegal bombings of other countries targeted in what th US government has called the war on errror. A string of presihas even been charged

tion that was beginning to collapse her right lung. She woke up
the next day in ICU he next day in ICe lon oxygen the prayers of her supporters and those remaining angels of mercy unbroken by the plague.
In case you were wondering, she is now recovering rapidly and getting stronger every day, and with gratitude we acknowl edge that in order to work long in the medical profession, you
must have a calling. Even without the plague, the pressures on the medical community are enormous
When you add the additional pressures of Covid-19, the

cal class and the overwhelming numbers of sick people added to
the burden the damase to our healthcare system and it's workers the burden, the damage to our healthcare system and it's workers
has been widespread. Some who were once healers are now just
employees. You can see the exhaustion in their eyes, the employees. You can see the exhaustion in their eyes, the anger
and the despair. The woman in our story this week had the misfortune of choosing a practice where the pressures of pandemic had precipitated fear and resentment of the very patients they were meant to help.

who were forced to work over 90 hours a week for a hospital corporation which played the victim of rising costs and being understaffed - but somehow managed to report record profits.

areas areas. They like spots with logs, leaf, and rocks for cover. They
are capable of living in suburban areas with people around. are capable of living in suburban areas with people around.
Timber Rattlesnakes can grow to be about 5 feet
long. They have a color range from yellow to black. Their long. They have a color range from yellow to black. Their
backs are covered in brown or black chevron shaped crossbands. They like to live along wooded streambanks. They
like old debris piles, old burrows and rock crevices. They
will also have the will also have the iconic rattle on the end of their tail
Most people will talk about being able to tell if a snake is venomous from looking at the shape of its head. General-
ly speaking, venomous snakes will have a triangular shaped without getting close and handling the snake, which is never advised. Non-venomous snakes can flatten their heads and ap pear to have more triangular heads too. Some of the markings
on non-venomous snakes can be confused with copperheads. make sure that your dryer vent is covered with a screen to
prevent snakes from wandering inside. Remove piles of debris, leaf piles, or wood piles, because those create habitats for snakes. Thick ground cover like tall grass or ivy can cre
ate hiding spots for snakes or the rodents, frogs, and insects ate hiding spots for snakes or the rodents, frogs, and insect
that snakes like to eat. Keeping the space around your house
clear will decrease the likelihod of a snake being present clear will decrease the likelihood of a snake being present.
Most of the time people are bitten when they try to kill a snake. Non-venomous snakes are protected by
state law. If you are bitten 1) stay calm; 2) Get competent medical help as quickly as possible; 3) Keep the af
fected limb level with the body; 4) Do not cut, suck, or ap ply ice or a tourniquet to the wound. Wear closed toed shoes
when walking in areas where snakes might be present. when walking in areas where snakes might be present
