Soccer: Indians, Lady Indians advance to State Sweet 16

Both Towns County soccer teams are moving on to this week's Class A D-II Sweet 16 following the men's first-round bye and the Lady Indians 2-0 win over Treutlen County on Tuesday, April 16.

The No. 7 Indians visit 10th-ranked Wheeler County on Wednesday, April 24, while the No. 3 Lady Indians travel to Christian Heritage (Dalton) on April 23.

Lady Indians 2, Treutlen County 0 - Despite the lowscoring effort, Towns County wasn't threatened during its first-round win over Treutlen on April 16 in Hiawassee.

A smothering Lady Indians defense held the Vikings without a corner kick and only three shots on goal over 80 minutes. Meanwhile, Abby Gardella and Chloe Sutton chipped in one goal each with Halie Arrowood dishing out a pair of assists.

"We just didn't finish as well as we would like," Lady Indians head coach Clay Livingston said. "We did an above-average job on possession, but we know we will have to finish better to go deep [in the playoffs]. That will definitely continue to be a high priority at practice.'

Baseball: Indians win three of four, walk-off Union Co. on Senior Night

Towns County baseball won three of four to close out the regular season, highlighted by a walk-off Senior Night victory over Union County on Thursday, April 18.

The Indians travel to Glascock County in the opening round of the Class A D-II playoffs for a best-of-three series beginning Tuesday, April 23. The winner will visit No. 1-ranked Schley County on April 29.

Indians 3, Union County 2 - Senior Connor Chastain's sacrifice fly scored Zane Floyd in the bottom of the seventh to cap the Towns County comeback.

Tied at 2-2 entering the Indians' seventh, Floyd worked a seven-pitch walk, then advanced to second on a groundout. The senior immediately swiped third and Chastain lined out to center, allowing Floyd to score.

Indians 8, Hayesville, NC 9 - The Jackets built a 6-0 lead before Towns County responded with 8 runs in the fifth and sixth innings, however, Hayesville raced ahead with three in the sixth to hold on at home.

Cunningham doubled twice and knocked in four during a 2 for 3 game. Chauncey went 2 for 4 with 2 RBIs; Kirby ended his day 2 for 3 with a walk.

Union County sophomore Gunnar Akins nearly escaped the bases-loaded, no-out iam with consecutive strikeouts before Matthew Chastain made him pay via a base hit to left-center.

Matthew Chastain finished 1 for 3 with 2 RBIs; McConnell went 2 for 3 with a run; Connor Chastain drove 1-for-3 day; Chauncey went 1 for 3 with a run; Floyd ended during a 1-for-4 day; McNabb

The Indians sent 12 batters to the plate in the sixth, beginning with a McConnell walk, followed by Cunningham's go-ahead double. Baldwin reached on a bunt single and Sarafin walked to load the bags for Matthew Chastain, who plated Cunningham via an infield single.

Floyd was plunked to make it 5-2, and an error off the bat of Kirby built a 7-2 margin. Another Rabun County error awarded the Indians a run and McConnell capped the scoring with a one-out single.

Matthew Chastain worked the final two innings, allowing 2 hits and an earned run while striking out two. McConnell started and fanned 8 over 5 innings, giving up 2 hits and 2 earned runs.

Matthew Chastain went 2 for 4 with a run and an RBI; Floyd and Kirby each drove
